22 case studies on farmers and consultants in Esperance and Geraldton Port Zones were compiled into a book investigating different concepts in using VRT which is available in print and electronic format. Two YouTube videos were also produced.

Key Learning:

VRT is useful if you start off simply and work from there. There are two streams of people using VRT – those relying on consultants and those who are just dabbling in it a bit on their own. VRT can be an inefficient use of a managers’ time if they let it; and it can cause a lot of stress – but using it simply, it can be a great way to save on input costs and increase production.
